



Instructions for Authors

Paper submission for *Economia Internazionale* / *International Economics*

Submission

Submission is free.

All papers submitted will be forwarded to the anonymous referees of the Journal without indication of the author's identity.

Manuscripts

Manuscripts should be prepared in MS Word using Times New Roman 12 point font and double spacing. Notes and references must be double spaced. An abstract should be provided at the beginning of the article complemented by JEL classification and keywords. All pages should be numbered.

Acknowledgments and information on grants received should be presented in a footnote, denoted by an asterisk. All other footnotes of the paper should be numbered consecutively. The text should be double-spaced throughout.

Thereafter, the corresponding author's, e-mail addresses and the main affiliation should be given.

When submitting an article, please ensure that all articles are formatted to conform to the guidelines below. Please do not hesitate to contact the editorial office if you are unsure of any style points or if you have any queries (Email: economia.internazionale@ge.camcom.it). It is the responsibility of the author to ensure that articles conform to *Economia Internazionale/International Economics* style; failure to do this may result in delay to publication.

The list of references should be listed in alphabetical order by author's name and then further sorted chronologically if necessary. References should appear as follows (abbreviate first names, provide issue numbers of journals):

Sections and sub-sections

Section titles should be formatted as follows:

1. INTRODUCTION (SMALL CAPS)
2. DESIGN OF THE EVENT STUDY (SMALL CAPS)
- 2.1 *Defining A Successful Event* (Italics)

Equations

Displayed formulas should be numbered consecutively on the right as (1), (2), etc.

All characters are to be defined and used unambiguously.

Tables

The set of tables can follow at the end of the paper or be inserted in the text directly. Tables should be of a reasonable number and size. Columns should be clearly designed and explanations should be given in footnotes below the table body. Table titles should be formatted as follows:

Figures

The set of figures can follow at the end of the paper or be inserted in the text directly.

Figures should be complete and clearly drawn. Special care should be taken to ensure that lettering and symbols are of a comparable size and readable even if reduced to fit the journal's page format. Figure titles should be formatted as follows:

FIGURE 1 - *Estimated Trends*

Footnotes

Footnotes should be numbered sequentially as superscript Arabic numerals in the appropriate positions in the text and placed before punctuation.

Proofs

Page proofs will be sent to the corresponding author for checking and making essential corrections. All unpublished and forthcoming sources should be updated, if possible, using recently published sources.
